Artist Spotlight: Jerry Douglas



During the cool summer nights in early August, many sounds can be heard coming from Lindley Park - families laughing, music, cheering, and people having a great time. On Saturday night, August 3rd at 8pm, a bluegrass sound will fill the Bozeman air; that of 13-time Grammy Award winner Jerry Douglas.

After attending a Flatt and Scruggs concert at the young age of 8, Douglas picked up the Dobro and never looked back. He has since played on over 2000 albums for a plethora of artists including Garth Brooks, Ray Charles, Phish, Elvis Costello, John Folgerty, Emmylou Harris,

Dolly Parton and many more. His talents have lead him to scoring a movie - *Get Low* starring Robert Duvall, Sissy Spacek, and Billy Murray, playing on the "*O Brother, Where Art Thou?* soundtrack and its spinoff live disc *Down from the Mountain*", and "becoming the co-Music Director of the BBC TV series *Transatlantic Sessions*".

While Douglas has played with many bands and co-founded one ("Boone Creek Boys with Ricky Skaggs"), his solo career has been nothing short of impressive. His 14th album, *Traveler*, was just released, he was the recipient of the 2011 Annual American Honors and Awards coveted Lifetime Achievement Award for Instrumentalist, and has been the Country Music Association Musician of the Year three times. While playing solo has worked well for him, you can still find Douglas playing with Alison Kraus & Union Station, of which he has been a member of since 1998.

We are happy to have Jerry Douglas perform on the Main Stage on August 3rd and hope to see you all there!
