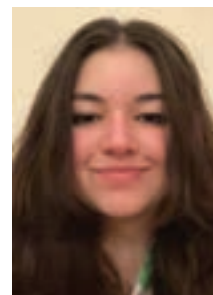

Bozeman community. Pulling off a multi-day event of this magnitude is no small feat—and Sweet Pea has been doing it for nearly half a century! That really is something special.

I joined Sweet Pea as Executive Director in February 2024, after volunteering with the organization for several years prior. As a lifelong musician and woodworking hobbyist myself, the mission of “promoting and cultivating the arts” resonated with me, and I quickly found a like-minded community with the people who make it all possible. The backbone of this organization is the volunteer Board of Directors, who believe so strongly in what Sweet Pea has to offer that they pour their hearts and souls into countless unpaid hours of work, ensuring that our activities and events go off without a hitch. I am so grateful for such a dedicated team of people with whom I get to work daily; their perseverance, time, and infectious energy is simply unparalleled. Although the Festival is a special weekend in and of itself, Sweet Pea is so much more. **Sweet Pea, A Festival of the Arts is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization** committed to promoting the arts and making the arts accessible to all. With one full-time employee, one

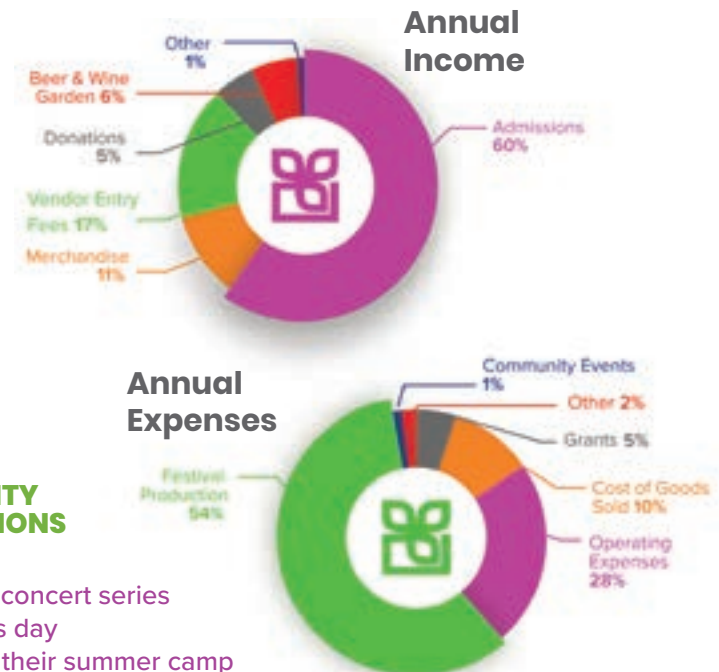
part-time employee, and 38 volunteer board members, we are a small but mighty organization. Sweet Pea generates a local economic impact of approximately \$3.5 million, of which \$2.1 million is retained by the local community—and we give every cent made in excess of our operational costs BACK to the Gallatin Valley community. **The Sweet Pea Festival serves as our largest fundraiser**, allowing us to provide grants to organizations such as the Montana Science Center, the Bozeman Library Foundation, Eagle Mount, Random Acts of Silliness, the Gallatin Valley Rest Home, SLAM, and many others. Since 1986, we have given more than \$400,000 in arts grants to nearly 100 different organizations! So, thank you for being here. Your support truly means the world to us.

We give every cent made in excess of our operational costs BACK to the Gallatin Valley community.

As our community grows and flourishes, Sweet Pea also intends to grow and continue to expand our mission of promoting the arts. We welcome feedback and encourage anyone with an interest to check out our open board positions and volunteer opportunities. We also hope you'll join us at our Winter Art Show, Gingerbread House Contest, and Ice Sculpture Event, and as we support Run to the Pub and the Bozeman Triathlon. Charming Japanese folktales are combined with traditional musical instruments, magical masks, origami, and mime to create a spellbinding story. Kuniko's marvelous performance promotes cross-cultural communication and understanding in an entertaining way. For the past 25 years, Kuniko Yamamoto has performed her solo shows in theaters, schools, colleges, and festivals across the country.

Oliver Hazard

Waterville, OH

The story of Waterville, OH, indie-folk trio Oliver Hazard—Michael Belazis (vocals, guitar), Griffin McCulloch (vocals, keys) and Devin East (vocals, guitar)—is the digital age’s version of classic band myth-making. One member of the band came home to Ohio after leading camping trips in California and decided to make an album with two childhood friends. They won a Facebook raffle to record one song at a studio. Instead, they played their whole album straight through once, resulting in their debut LP *34 N*

River (2018). *The Fader* called the album a “folk-pop masterpiece,” and the band was booked at Bonnaroo and Mountain Jam shortly thereafter. In 2019, the band released their six-track EP, *The Flood*, which *Billboard* called a “souvenir.” This brings the band to their sophomore, self-titled album (July 2023), featuring music from the band’s recent *Northern Lights* EP, plus five additional songs.

The sound of their upcoming 10-track LP blends delicate arrangements with sturdy melodies. The LP is the work of three individual singers, songwriters and multi-instrumentalists, who share an organic connection in the craft—sensibilities that yield music that’s harmonic, haunting,

and also ambitious and surprising. “This album feels different than anything we’ve done in the past. We’re very simple people. I think the album reflects that, and I hope it captures something you probably can’t describe yourself, but that speaks to you,” Dev says.

Rayland Baxter

Nashville, TN

For the making of his fourth album, *If I Were a Butterfly*, Rayland Baxter holed up for over a year at a former rubber band factory turned studio in the Kentucky countryside. “I spent that year living in a barn with the squirrels and the birds, and I discovered so much about music and how to create it,” says the Tennessee-bred singer/songwriter. “Instead of going into a studio with a producer for two weeks, I just waited for the record to build itself. I’d get up and go outside, see a butterfly and connect that with some impulsive thought I’d had three months ago, and suddenly a song I’d been working on would make sense. That’s how the whole album came to be.”

The follow-up to 2018’s critically acclaimed *Wide Awake*, *If I Were a Butterfly* finds Baxter slowly piecing together the album’s patchwork of lush psychedelia and Beatlesque pop. In addition, Baxter recorded with a remarkable lineup of musicians, including Shakey Graves, Lennon Stella, several members of Cage the Elephant, and Zac Cockrell of Alabama Shakes. In an especially meaningful turn, two of the

album’s tracks feature the elegant pedal steel work of his father, Bucky Baxter (a musician who performed with Bob Dylan and who passed away in May 2020). Thanks to the extraordinary care and ingenuity behind its creation, *If I Were a Butterfly* arrives as a work of rarefied magic, capable of stirring up immense feeling while leaving the listener happily wonderstruck.

For Baxter, the act of self-producing such a sonically and emotionally expansive body of work proved both exhilarating and arduous. “It really wore me out to spend all that time alone at the studio, editing the hell out of this record; my heart definitely suffered,” he says. “But I also had the guidance of my dad, who was in my dreams all the time—if I was moving too fast, I’d hear him telling me to slow down.”

Even in its most somber moments, *If I Were a Butterfly* wholly fulfills Baxter’s mission of imparting a certain purposeful joy. “I hope that this album makes people feel the way I do whenever I listen to my favorite records, and that it gives them a platform to dream on.” www.raylandbaxter.com

Yates' "earworms of sadness" have gained him a new legion of fans who, drawn to his "stunning candidness and relatability" (*No Depression*), have shared numerous fan covers on social media and helped spur a dedicated surge of audience growth.

The new album found great success in streaming, where songs were shared on playlists including "Your Favorite Coffeehouse," "Infinite Indie-Folk," "Fresh Folk," and more. Guest vocalists
